Message from the CEO

Dear Friends:

We all know the final election day is Tuesday. We also know that the election will not likely end on Tuesday. By the time you read this, some 50% of California's registered voters will have cast their votes.

I remember when no one was mailed a ballot. I always loved Election Day. I loved standing in line, even in my home state of Michigan, where the first Tuesday in November was almost always cold with rain, sleet, and lots of wind.



I love the right to vote and that we the people give consent to those who govern. When my children were young, I took them to stand in line with me to feel our freedom, to feel democracy.

To me, there is nothing more important than our freedom. Our democracy is far from perfect, but I've seen first-hand what happens when countries and territories don't have the right to vote. Dictatorships, political repression, no free press, egregious human rights violations, torture, unlimited pre-trial detention, sham trials and unchecked authority.

I just interviewed President Reagan's Chief Speechwriter, Ken Khachigian, in my latest podcast.

Ken is a long-time Southern California resident who has served two Presidents: Richard Nixon and Ronald Reagan. He just published <u>a book</u> about his experience working for the two Presidents - both from California.

Reagan spoke repeatedly about the value of our freedom. Ken was the chief speechwriter for President Reagan's 1981 inaugural address. Below is an excerpt from that address:

"I believe we, the Americans of today, are ready to act worthy of ourselves, ready to do what must be done to ensure happiness and liberty for ourselves, our children, and our children's children. And as we renew ourselves here in our own land, we will be seen as having greater strength throughout the world. We will again be the exemplar of freedom and a beacon of hope for those who do not now have freedom."

Please cherish the right to vote and remember to vote before or on November 5.





NAIOP SoCal 2024 Voter Guide

We're pleased to share the NAIOP SoCal 2024 Voter Guide. Many state and local measures under consideration in this year's ballot affect the commercial real estate industry, jobs, economic growth and the quality of life in our communities. NAIOP SoCal's recommendations are rooted in an openness to dialogue and a commitment to exploring balanced solutions related to land use, taxes, regulations, building codes, and development restrictions.

NAIOP SoCal is nonpartisan and does not endorse candidates or ballot measures based on political affiliation. With 122 cities, 2 major counties (Los Angeles and Orange) and several special districts in our region, this guide does not cover every election. Final recommendations were developed with input from the NAIOP SoCal Legislative Affairs Committee – open for all NAIOP SoCal Members to join – and the NAIOP SoCal Candidates PAC.

Some of you have already received your ballots, so please take a moment to vote. In this decisive election year, your voice matters!

NAIOP SoCal Submits Comment Letter to SCAQMD Governing Board Expressing Concern Over the District's Proposed Amended Rules 1111 & 1121

Dear Chair Delgado:

On behalf of NAIOP SoCal, we appreciate the opportunity to provide comments on Agenda Item #2A - Certify Final Subsequent Environmental Assessment for Proposed Amended Rule 1111 – Reduction of NOx Emissions from Natural Gas-Fired Furnaces and Proposed Amended Rule 1121 – Reduction of NOx Emissions from Small Natural Gas-Fired Water Heaters; and request to Amend Rule 1111 and Rule 1121.

With nearly 1,300 Members, NAIOP SoCal is the leading nonprofit organization for commercial property owners, developers, investors, brokers, general contractors, architects, engineers and finance professionals in the industrial, office, retail and mixed-use multifamily real estate sectors across the counties of Los Angeles and Orange.

Our Members are committed to reducing their carbon footprint while meeting the needs of our tenants. Installation of solar energy panels, energy efficient lighting controls, outdoor water conservation devices and other energy-reducing measures can be found throughout the region on commercial and industrial buildings. And, due to updates to California's building codes, commercial and industrial properties are much more energy efficient than similar properties built several decades ago.

NAIOP SoCal is concerned that the proposed rules do not take into account issues facing commercial and industrial real estate property owners and their tenants. The fact that commercial property owners are not considered an affected industry by District staff highlights this concern. The Preliminary Draft Staff Report for PAR 1111 and PAR 1121 states that the proposed regulations would affect "manufacturers, distributors, retailers, resellers, and installers" of natural gas-fired furnaces and water heaters. We believe that commercial and industrial property owners and their tenants should also be considered an affected industry, since they will be the ones to eventually shoulder the costs of complying with the regulations. In addition, we are concerned that the socioeconomic analysis to be conducted by District staff will be flawed. We believe that such a study will not represent an accurate picture of the costs to comply with the proposed regulations. Our concerns are predicated on the fact that commercial and industrial real estate are not considered affected industries, and impacts to such industries may not have been included in the analysis.

As a case in point, office buildings built in the 1970s were built without central heating and air. Property owners would be faced with large expenses to retrofit such buildings, in order to comply with PAR 1111 and PAR 1121.

Another example will be the expenses required to retrofit more commonly installed "split systems." These types of systems usually have one portion of its unit outside and the other mounted on the inside. An increase in capital expenses on buildings with existing AC is inevitable due to the total replacement of these split systems, since building owners will not be allowed to simply replace the heater if the latter fails. They will be required to replace both sides of the "split system" – the indoor piece and the one mounted outdoors.

Who is expected to pay for the new furnaces and water heaters? Who is expected to work with the utilities to make sure new electrical hook-ups can be made in a timely manner for new tenants to occupy a property? The likely answer: Commercial and industrial property owners. We urge the District to incorporate the costs and potential delays in occupancy for new tenants as part of the accompanying socioeconomic analysis.

Finally, NAIOP SoCal is concerned that the proposed rules assume that electrical utility providers will be able to meet the increased demand for electricity that will be created by this shift from natural gas equipment to electrical equipment. NAIOP SoCal is concerned that the current electrical infrastructure system does not have the capacity to meet the additional demand that will be created due to the proposed rules.

We urge the SCAQMD Governing Board to defer consideration of the proposed rules until February 2025 or later, in order to provide a sufficient amount of time to engage the commercial and industrial real estate sectors, and discuss issues affecting commercial property owners and their tenants. We welcome the opportunity to meet with the District to discuss our concerns on PAR 1111 and PAR 1121, and provide examples as to how the proposed rules would impact our Members. 
